

TERMS AND CONDITIONS – YOUR CALL SCHOOLS COMPETITION 2020

By entering the **Your Call Film Competition** (Competition), entrants (Entrants) agree to be bound by the following terms and conditions. Failure to abide by these terms and conditions may render an Entrant ineligible for the competition.

1. Entrants must submit their entries via the yourcall.rocks website. Any entry or supporting materials received via another method shall be destroyed and will not be considered for submission.
2. All entries must follow the entry guidelines found in the Application Pack on the yourcall.rocks competition page and Entrants must ensure they meet the eligibility criteria for their entry to be valid.
3. The competition is open to all high school students and community groups enrolled in Western Australia as of the commencement of the 2020 academic year.
4. Entrants can work individually or as part of a group with a maximum of 3 students per group.
5. Employees of Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, the WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People, and their affiliates, children or relatives who may qualify for the competition are ineligible to enter.
6. Entrants must first register for the competition via the yourcall.rocks competition page by **Wednesday 5 August 2020** with entries due on **Wednesday 14 October 2020**.
7. An Entrant must submit a video of up to 3 minutes in duration (inclusive of any credits) relating to Street Safety as outlined on the yourcall.rocks competition page. Entrants must also answer a set of questions relating to their film and its content including how their film addresses the issue of street safety.
8. Schools and community/youth organisations must be prepared to establish a designated YouTube account in order to facilitate their participating students to upload and promote their short films.
9. Entries must not contain any representation of nudity, racism or inappropriate comments, language or vision. Any such entry will be considered void and ineligible for consideration.
10. Completed films and all-inclusive content must comply with the terms and conditions specified as per You Tube and your school or community/youth organisation YouTube account. This is to facilitate the lawful uploading and public viewing of your film/s through the YouTube medium. Compliance and adherence to this, as well as that of complying with all National and International Copyright laws and regulations, is the sole responsibility of the film makers.

- 11.** Entrants must complete the online entry form and submit their film described in the Application Pack (found on the yourcall.rocks website), by **14 October 2020 at 4:00pm WST**. Entrants must have uploaded all content for judging by this time.
- 12.** Each uploaded film must be named “Your Call Schools Competition 2020 entry” and insert name of the short film submission.
- 13.** Entrants are responsible for the cost (if any) of creating your competition entry as well as all other costs associated with participation in the competition.
- 14.** The groups responsible for the top 10 finalist’s films and two accompanying guests per participant will be invited to attend a formal awards ceremony in July 2020 with further information provided closer to the date.
- 15.** On announcing the 10 finalists, voting for the ***Student Choice Award***, sponsored by Commissioner for Children and Young People will commence using a social media platform. This award, with a \$1000.00 prize voucher, will be announced at the awards ceremony in July 2020. An additional \$100 prize voucher will also be drawn from those who vote for the Student Choice Award. Full details can be found on the yourcall.rocks website.
- 16.** The winning group who works on the new Street Safety video will be launched on the Your Call website in **December 2020** and promoted through social and mass media.
- 17.** There is a prize pool for the three top entries, as well as the Student Choice Award plus the potential to work with professional film makers to develop an interactive film, hosted on the Your Call website (Youth brand of Constable Care Child Safety Foundation).
- 18.** Without limitation, Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People, may use all or part of the 2020 Your Call Schools Competition entries for its consumer campaigns, promotions, marketing and media, and may sublicense that right to third parties.
- 19.** All entries become the property of Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People. The non-exclusive worldwide rights for all media submitted must be available for five (5) years for use by Constable Care Child Safety Foundation.
- 20.** All copyright, moral rights and rights of personality for all content must be cleared. Failure to clear these rights will result in removal of the entry from consideration in the competition. Constable Care Child Safety Foundation takes no responsibility for any failure by an Entrant to obtain the necessary authorisations. Entrants warrant that their entries do not infringe the intellectual property rights or any other rights of any person. Entrants (or their parents/guardians/teacher/school) will fully indemnify Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People against any

loss, costs, expenses, demands or liability, whether direct or indirect, arising out of a claim by a third party or another party.

- 21.** The Competition judges' decision is final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into regarding the judging process or any outcomes reached.
- 22.** Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, the WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People, their directors, officers and employees, shall assume no liability resulting from losses, delays, mistaken addresses on emails received, typographical errors, technical computer malfunctions or any other mishap during the Entry process.
- 23.** All personal information, such as your name, address, email address and school is collected for the purposes of administering this competition and may be used by Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, the WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People, for promotional and marketing purposes. By providing this information, you consent to it being used for the stated purpose.
- 24.** Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, WA Police Force and Commissioner for Children and Young People reserve the right at any time and from time to time to modify or discontinue, temporarily or permanently, this Competition with or without notice due to reasons outside their control. This includes the right to cancel the Competition if fewer than 10 entries are received by the Closing Date or the entrants are not of a standard that supports the final outcomes of the competition.
- 25.** If Constable Care Child Safety Foundation, WA Police Force or Commissioner for Children and Young People cancels or postpones the Competition, or part thereof they:
 - a. shall not be required to conduct the Competition at any other time; and
 - b. shall not be liable to any person for any loss or damage arising out of, or in connection with, the cancellation or postponement of the Competition (including, without limitation liability for negligence); and
 - c. will not be required to award prizes to any Entrants.
